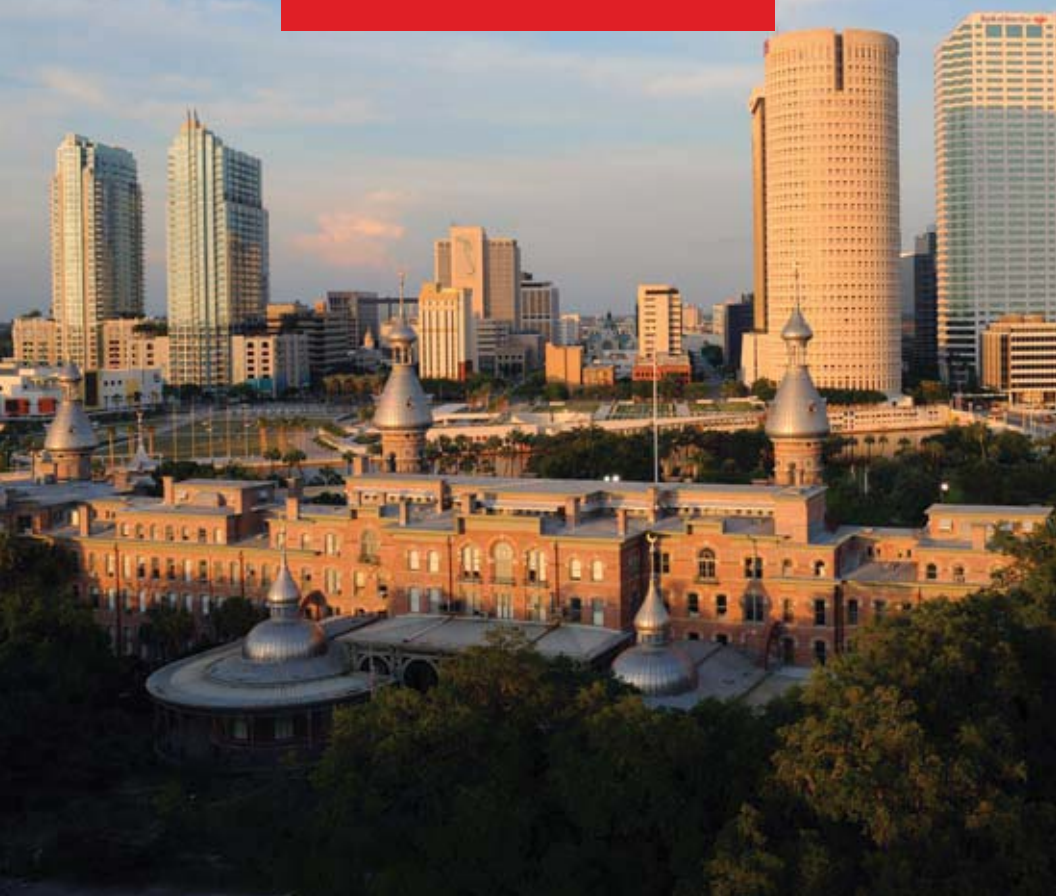

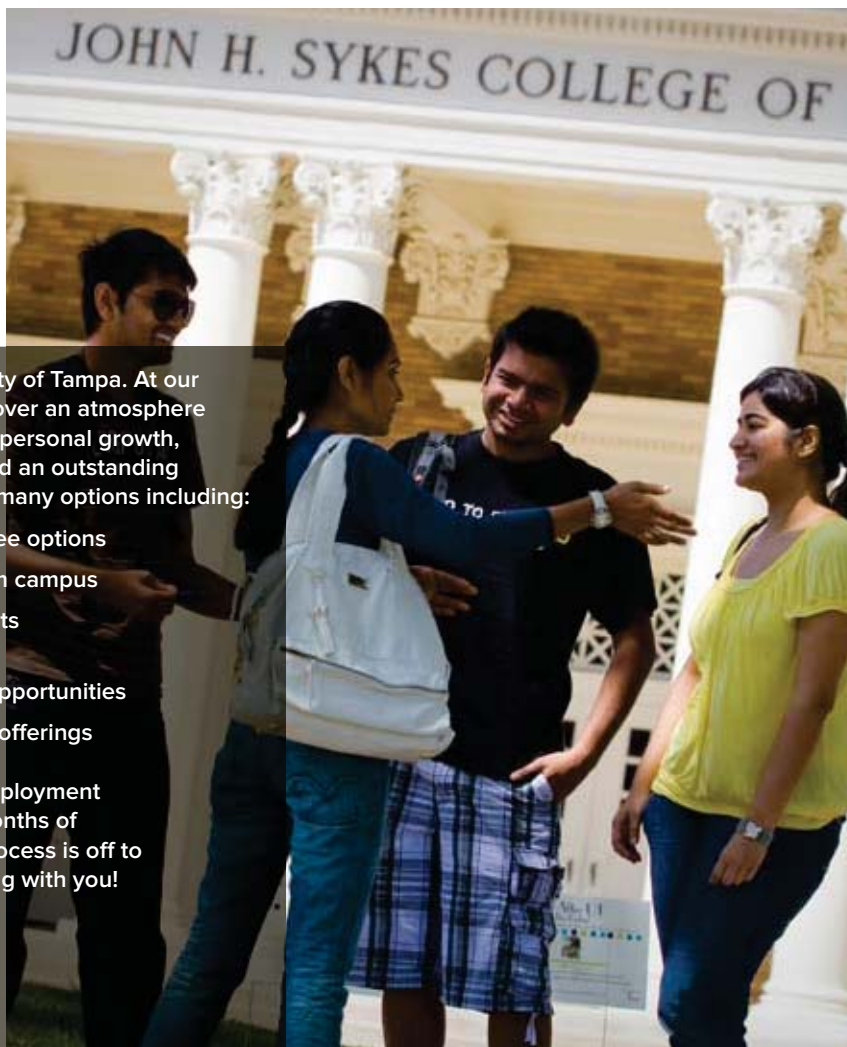

## History of UT

Early in the morning on Aug. 2, 1933, a battered pick-up truck arrived at Hillsborough High School. This was the day when Tampa Junior College was transformed into The University of Tampa and when its headquarters moved from the local high school to what is now known as Plant Hall. Riding on the truck was its president, Frederic H. Spaulding, the former principal of Hillsborough High School and the man who had been the motivating force behind establishing the first local university for Tampa's high school graduates.

Formerly the Tampa Bay Hotel, the building represented, and still remains, a symbol of the city and its history. Local historians credit its builder, railroad and shipping magnate Henry B. Plant, with the transformation of Tampa from a sleepy fishing village to what would become a vibrant city of the 21st century.

Built between 1888 and 1891, the hotel was designed to surpass all other grand winter resorts. At a cost of \$3 million, the 511-room giant rose to a flamboyant height of five stories, surrounded by ornate Victorian gingerbread and topped by Moorish minarets, domes and cupolas.

The rooms that once hosted Teddy Roosevelt and his Rough Riders, Sarah Bernhart, Babe Ruth (who signed his first baseball contract in the hotel's grand dining room), Clara Barton, Stephen Crane, Mrs. Ulysses S. Grant, the Prince of Wales, the Queen of England and many other celebrities of their day, are today's classrooms, laboratories, public rooms, academic and administrative offices – the heart of the University that now fans out around Plant Hall. ■

## Residence Life

The University of Tampa provides many lifestyle options. New students should expect to share a room with at least one other student. Singles are reserved for upper-class continuing students.

All student rooms are air-conditioned. Cable television and local telephone service (with voice mailbox) are included

in room rates. Each room is furnished with a bed (36 x 80 inches), desk, chair, closet/wardrobe and dresser. Students living on campus have free Internet access through Ethernet connections in their rooms. There are lounges, vending machines, laundry facilities, game rooms and study areas in all buildings.

**Alfred and Beverly Austin Hall** opened in fall 1998, and houses 425 students who live in suite rooms with two double rooms or one double and one triple room sharing one bath. This state-of-the-art nine story facility houses both men and women, and includes rooms specially fitted for physically-disabled students. A number of single rooms for continuing upper-class students also are available.

The **Boathouse** is home to 17 residents. Located on the banks of the Hillsborough River, it is convenient to the library and Plant Hall. Residents enjoy the small community, and a large deck overlooking the river and downtown skyline.

**Brevard Hall** opened its doors in fall 2000 and is home to 460 men and women. Suite-style rooms with shared bathroom and common area and the option of either a private or shared bedroom make Brevard Hall a very attractive place for upper-class students to live. Brevard Hall has ample study space and social spaces on the first floor. The L-shaped building creates an ideal courtyard for relaxing outdoors. Each suite has a living room between the bedrooms, providing plenty of space where residents can gather.

**David A. Straz Jr. Hall**, an apartment-style hall, opened in fall 2003. Straz Hall is eight stories high and houses 480 residents. Each apartment has a full kitchen, shared bathroom, living area where students can gather and four single sleeping rooms. On the first floor there is plenty of community space where residents can study and socialize, either inside or outside.

**Urso Hall** opened in fall 2006. Located conveniently across the street from the main entrance to campus, this 11-story building houses 182 upper-class and graduate students. The residence hall has single and double apartments with mini-kitchens and private bathrooms.

**McKay Hall**, recently refurbished, is a two-story residence hall designed for 190 men and women. Located on the bank of the Hillsborough River, it is conveniently located next to Plant Hall and the library. On the west side of McKay (Plant Hall side) are double rooms that have their own external entrances. Two double rooms share a bathroom. The east side (riverside) features double and triple rooms along an interior hallway sharing common hall bathrooms.

**ResCom**, UT's on-campus apartment complex, is home to 235 upper-class students. Predominantly seniors and juniors, ResCom residents enjoy living in four-bedroom/one-bathroom apartments, each with a full kitchen (including oven, stove and full-size refrigerator) and a living room. Many second- and third-floor apartments have balconies, as well. The ResCom Clubhouse is the site for many special programs and events. The big-screen TV, pool table and kitchenette create a place for residents to relax. ResCom's courtyard, a hot spot on campus, has BBQ grills and picnic tables.

**Smiley**, UT's smallest "traditional" residence hall, is built around a sunny courtyard, and houses 130 men and women. Known for its close-knit community, it is located in the center of campus on the Flagpole Circle next to Plant Hall. Almost all the rooms in Smiley are double rooms and share a suite bath.

**Stadium Center** opened in fall 2007 and houses 448 residents. These residents live in double rooms and have access to eight new dining venues. Each suite has a small living room and two double rooms that share a bathroom. The residents of this seven-story building also have the use of a large community room with a TV and kitchen on the second floor.

**The Vaughn Center** opened its doors in 2001. This nine-story multi-purpose facility was designed to re-center the social and residential life of UT students. Floors 3-8 house 525 students. Rooms in this hall are double or triple occupancy. While most rooms are suited to share a bath, several rooms contain their own baths. Students use a proximity card for elevator access to residential floors. The first two floors and the ninth floor include student dining, conference center, a two story cyber café, recreational area, student office space, computer lab and campus bookstore. The third floor has a small meeting room for tutoring and studying, a large community room with cozy furniture, and a full kitchen. Each floor has a small study or gathering space.

**The Howard Johnson Plaza** is our off-campus overflow residence hall. Students enjoy housekeeping service twice a week and all hotel facilities – pool, recreation room, parking, laundry machines, and restaurants. It is located about a half-mile from campus, and complementary shuttle service is provided. Several floors have been designated as traditional residence hall floors. Two students share one double room and a private bath. Resident assistants live on the floors and provide a traditional residential experience. Many of UT's 140 student organizations sponsor service projects as well.

# Campus Safety and Security

The University of Tampa considers the safety and security of all University community members integral to its educational mission. The Department of Campus Safety and Security works closely with the Dean of Students to ensure that guidelines, rules and procedures are properly communicated and executed. Security officers also coordinate with the Facilities Management Department to provide a clean and safe environment.

Officers patrol campus 24 hours a day, every day of the year. They also assist with services such as publishing crime prevention information, providing pedestrian escorts, assisting with personal property engraving, and vehicle registration.

## Safe Escort Service

The safety escort service is provided by the Student Government LASER Team (Law Abiding Students Ever Ready) during fall and spring terms for the safety of anyone walking alone on campus at night.

Upon request, a student will be assigned an escort to the requested on-campus destination. In addition, the escort service, when not en route to a destination, is on motorized patrol and will offer escort service to pedestrians who are walking alone at night on campus.

## SMART

The University of Tampa offers a free emergency alert text messaging service to students, faculty and staff. Spartan Mobile Alert (SMART) is an optional service that will only be used in potential or developing emergency circumstances. You will receive a UT text message alert advising you of the situation and where to get additional information and details. Sign up by logging onto SpartanWeb and clicking on the Spartan Mobile AleRT link on the left, then follow the instructions. ■

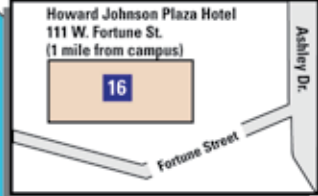

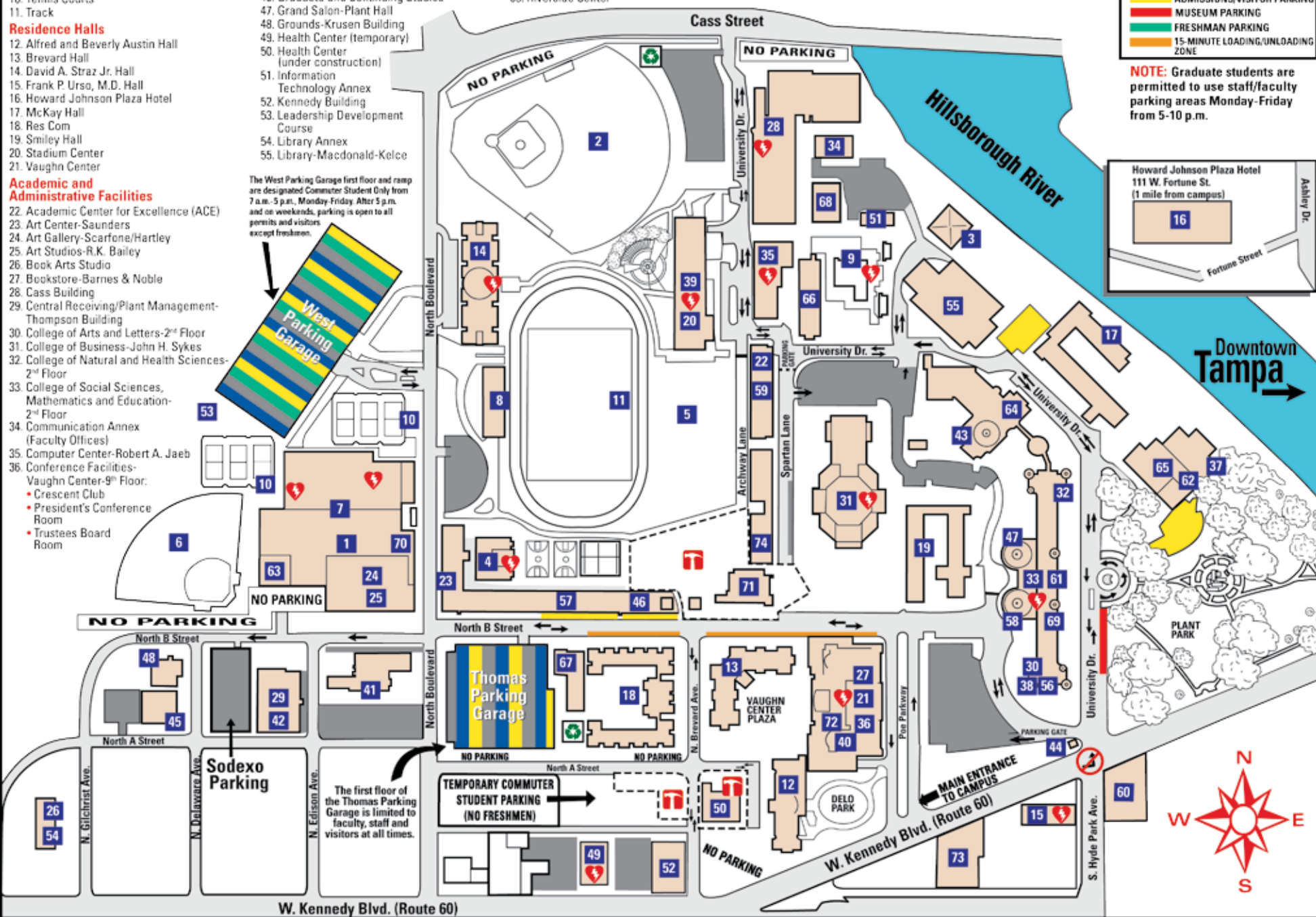

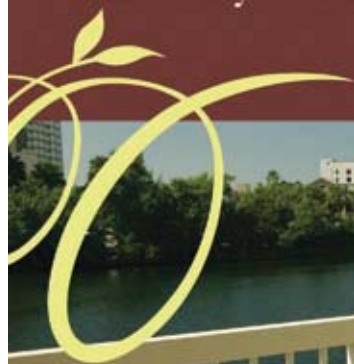
