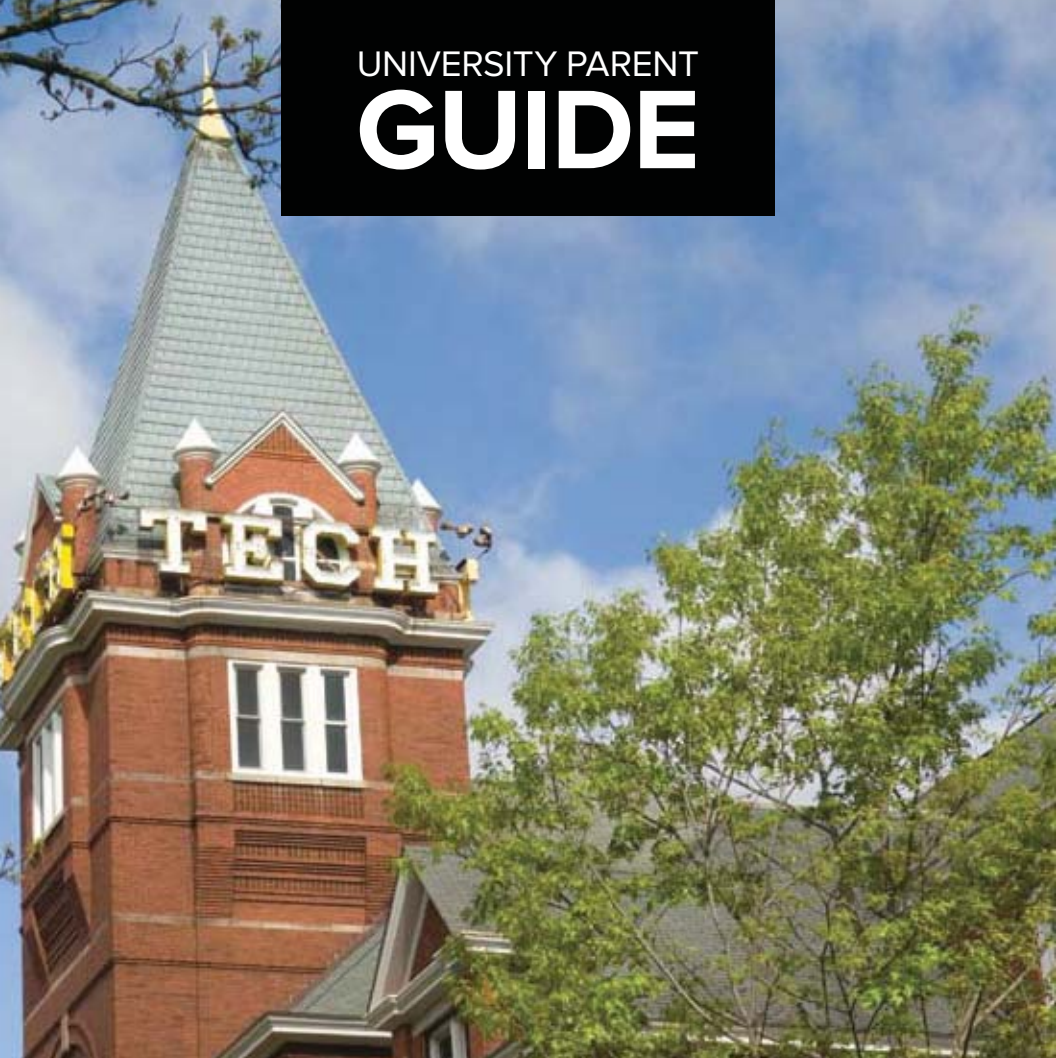

Helpful Transition Tips

Familial support contributes significantly to student success at Georgia Tech. Be sure to sign up to receive *ParentNews*, an electronic, monthly newsletter designed to keep you informed of campus events, key campus resources, and involvement opportunities. Here are some helpful tips on how to successfully assist your student during this exciting transition.

- Learn about the support services available to you and your student at Georgia Tech.
- Challenge your student to identify, define, and solve problems independently. This will help him or her succeed at Georgia Tech and in the future.
- Be alert to signs that your student is under significant stress, is taking unhealthy risks, or is ill. Discuss concerns openly with your student and assist him or her in developing a plan to address the problem. There are many campus resources available to help your student through these issues.
- Encourage your student to set and achieve personal goals and make responsible decisions related to academics, career planning, social interactions, and community engagement.
- Listen to and support your Georgia Tech student as he or she faces uncertainty and learns to perform in complex environments and challenging situations.
- Allow your student to accept consequences of his or her actions and accept responsibility for personal errors. Urge your student to examine disappointments and unexpected experiences in order to assess what caused them, what can be done about them, and how to avoid them in the future.
- Understand the limitations regarding access to student records, as delineated by federal requirements outlined in the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA).
- Help your student understand that because Tech is located in an urban setting, there are certain safety precautions that he or she will need to take.
- Support and encourage your student as he or she learns, performs, leads, or serves through campus and community activities.
- Stay connected by participating in volunteer opportunities. Georgia Tech has a lot to offer all members of our community. ■

Medical Records

All incoming students must comply with the Board of Regents of the University System of Georgia's immunization requirements. When your student is accepted to Georgia Tech, he or she is automatically placed on a registration hold and will not be allowed to register for classes until the immunization requirements are met. If the immunization requirements are not met, your student may not register for classes. Visit www.health.gatech.edu/Documents/GTImmATL10.pdf to access the necessary immunization forms. Fax the completed forms to Stamps Health Services (404) 385-0329.

Forms are due May 2, 2011, for summer semester enrollment and July 5, 2011, for fall semester enrollment. Always include your student's Georgia Tech ID number when contacting Health Services at immunization@health.gatech.edu.

Insurance Cards

All students must bring their health insurance cards to all visits. Referral appointments cannot be made without proper insurance information. For questions about insurance, call (404) 894-0633.

All incoming students are required to own laptops that can be carried to class. Barnes & Noble @ Georgia Tech provides educational discounts to students purchasing hardware, software, and peripherals as well as trained personnel who can assist with technological needs. The Department of Housing provides comprehensive support to residents of the on-campus residence halls through ResNet. Residential Technology Advisors (RTAs) provide telephone and onsite technical support to residents. Georgia Tech's Office of Information Technology (OIT) Support Center is available for questions about hardware configurations and can help troubleshoot software applications. The OIT Support Center is available for walk-in support. User assistants are also available in campus computing labs. During the warranty period, students who have purchased new computers should have hardware serviced by the manufacturer.

The Department of Housing coordinates the administration, assignment, and activities of all on-campus residence halls. All new students receive housing information with the notification of acceptance sent by the Office of Undergraduate Admission. All housing information (room sizes, rates, building type, policies, etc.) is available online or by calling. We encourage parents to visit www.housing.gatech.edu/parents prior to your student's arrival for move-in. This site contains important information on dates and deadlines as well as safety and security. ■

Mail Call

We encourage parents to stay in regular contact with their students while they are away at college. Parents have found that it is helpful to prearrange a day to “check in” with their students. E-mail, text messages, sending a card or letter, and sending care packages are great ways to keep the lines of communication open.

Campus Safety & Security

Providing a safe and secure environment while sustaining and nurturing an open campus is Georgia Tech's top priority. Faculty, staff, and administrators devote significant resources to the provision and maintenance of a safe and secure campus community. As members of the campus community, students also play a role in contributing to the health and well-being of their peers as well as themselves.

Police Department

The Georgia Tech Police Department has a staff of more than seventy-five certified police officers with a vast majority assigned to patrol. Officers utilize motorcycles, bicycles, vehicles, Segways, and foot patrols to keep campus safe. Georgia Tech police officers are on duty twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week. There are more than two hundred emergency phones strategically located across campus. Students and others on campus must comply with all state and local laws and Institute policies. EMERGENCIES

Emergency Preparedness

Georgia Tech is committed to providing emergency response plans to ensure the safety of the Tech community. The Emergency Preparedness division of the Police Department conducts threat and risk assessments as well as security audits; updates and maintains the emergency action plan; assists with individual facility plans; and plans and conducts realistic exercises to test plans. Campus Emergency Notification System

As part of its ongoing effort to safeguard students, faculty, and staff, Tech has implemented an emergency communications system that includes the Georgia Tech Emergency Notification System (GTENS) and the outdoor audio Siren Warning System (SWS). The GTENS

system allows students to receive time-sensitive emergency messages in the form of e-mail, voice mail, and text messages. All students receive e-mail alerts. In order to receive text messages and voice mail alerts, members of the campus community are asked to provide a cell phone number. While participation in the text and voice messaging notification is optional, enrolling is strongly encouraged. The information that students supply is considered confidential and will not be shared. Students will only be contacted through GTENS in the event of an emergency. Students can find instructions for how to sign up for text and voice mail campus alerts by visiting www.gatech.edu/emergency/notification.html. Classrooms are also equipped with the System to Create and Relay Emergency Action Messages (SCREAM) emergency notification system that displays

emergency alerts through the classroom projector. GTENS, the SWS, and the projector interruption system are means of simultaneous notification to target the campus population during an emergency.

Emergency with Your Student

During your student's time at Georgia Tech, we may need to contact you regarding an emergency. Our ability to do so depends on the accuracy of the emergency contact information we have in our system. Please urge your student to register your emergency contact information including cell phone number, home phone number(s), personal e-mail addresses, as well as your employer's name and phone number. This information is confidential. It is the student's responsibility to update the contact information by using the BuzzPort student portal www.buzzport.gatech.edu. ■

Finances, FERPA, & Policies

Fee Payment Information

The Office of the Bursar does not mail invoices to students. A complete Student Invoice Statement is available to students via the Oscar website. Any changes that adjust the fees will be updated immediately to show the most current information on the account. The web invoice also facilitates online payment options for credit card payments. Students may also authorize parents to pay tuition and fees online. Visit www.bursar.gatech.edu/billpayment_parents_instr.php for Parent Payment Portal instructions. Online payments will appear on the account instantaneously so that the student can confirm that his or her account has been paid. Students may access their Student Invoice Statement at <https://oscar.gatech.edu>. Select the menu option "Secured Access Login," then enter the student's ID number and PIN.

Note: It is the student's responsibility to verify that his or her account is paid in full by the fee payment deadline date.

BuzzCards

All Georgia Tech students are required to have a BuzzCard for identification purposes. Students are required to present state or federal issued

identification before they can receive their first BuzzCard. Students may use their BuzzCard for meals at dining halls as well as for access to athletic events and various campus services and facilities. The BuzzCard can also be used at on-campus vending machines, laundry facilities, and stores. For more information, visit www.buzzcard.gatech.edu. To estimate how much you may want to deposit on your student's BuzzCard, visit www.buzzcard.gatech.edu/tools-and-resources/deposit-estimator. Deposits may be made online, at the BuzzCard Center, or via deposit kiosks located on campus.

FERPA—Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) is a federal law that protects the privacy of student education records. While FERPA gives parents certain rights with respect to their student's education records, these rights transfer to the student when he or she reaches the age of 18 or attends a school beyond the high school level. If necessary, your student can print his or her unofficial transcript at any time and may request that an official transcript be sent to the designated party.

The U.S. Department of Education is responsible for overseeing FERPA. Visit www.ed.gov/policy/gen/guid/fpco/ferpa and www.catalog.gatech.edu/genregulations/ferpa.php for more information.

Student Alcohol and Illegal Drugs Policy

The purpose of Georgia Tech's Student Alcohol and Illegal Drugs Policy is to promote and educate about the lawful and responsible use of alcohol by students and to educate about illegal drugs in order to maintain an environment that is consistent



with the educational focus of Georgia Tech. Georgia Tech will comply with all federal, state, and local laws and policies, including the policies of the Board of Regents of the University System of Georgia, on the abuse of alcohol and other drugs by its students. The legal drinking age in the state of Georgia is twenty-one.

Each member of the Georgia Tech community should be involved in the implementation of and compliance with this policy. Unless otherwise stated by law, each individual retains responsibility for his or her actions at all times regardless of his or her mental or physical state, even if altered by alcoholic beverages or other drugs. The full policy is available at www.osi.gatech.edu.

Parental Notification Policy

Parents of students under the age of twenty-one may be notified when a student is found responsible for violating the Georgia Tech Student Alcohol and Illegal Drugs Policy when any of the following occur:

- When students endanger themselves or other students while under the influence of alcohol or other substances. Specific instances include DUI, fighting, alcohol poisoning, and hospitalization.
- When the Dean of Students determines that any future violations of the Institute's policy will most likely result in suspension from Georgia Tech.
- When a hearing officer determines that any future violations of the Institute's policy will likely result in removal from housing.

Holds

Many campus departments have the ability to place registration and/or transcript holds on students. A registration hold will prevent a student from adding/removing courses, dropping courses, and withdrawing from school. A transcript hold will prevent the aforementioned as well as the release of the student's academic records, including transcripts, degree verifications, and certifications of enrollment. A transcript hold is usually implemented when a student has a financial obligation to the Institute. The department that places the hold must also remove the hold. ■

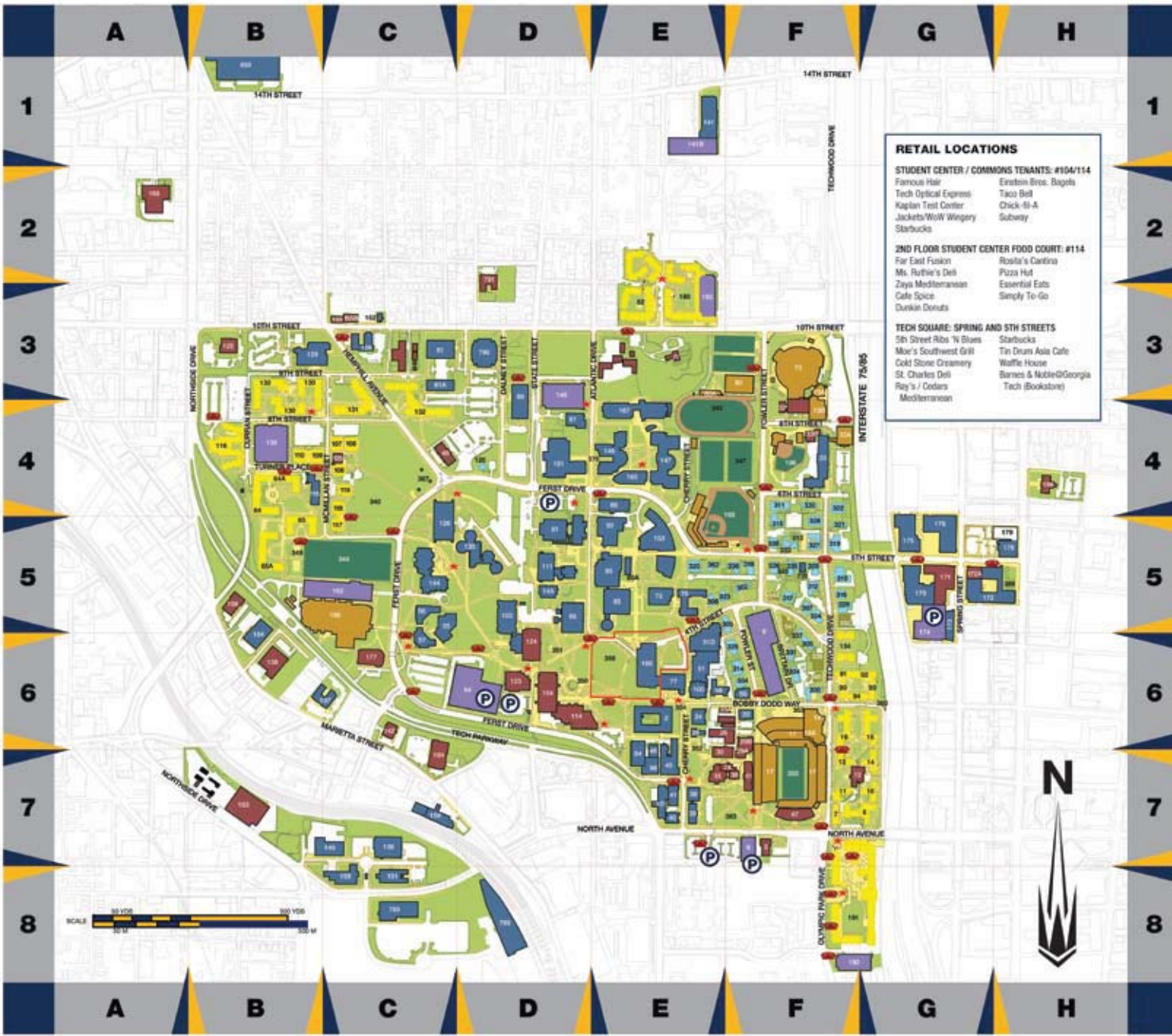
